At 1.2 miles, the march begins at The Islamic Center of Southern California/ICSC (434 S Vermont Ave.), incorporates brief stops outside Joohyang Presbyterian Church (on the New Hampshire side of the building) and inside Founder's Church of Religious Science (3281 W. 6th St.) and Immanuel Presbyterian Church (3300 Wilshire Bl.), and finishes at The Islamic Center of Southern California.
